FINANCIAL AID

A transformational Catholic education at Cathedral costs \$20,000 annually. We are able to cap tuition at \$7,000 per year because every student receives scholarship support that is generously provided by Cathedral High School and the AASF. Nearly all of our students receive additional financial aid based on their families' income, such that the average annual financial aid award totals \$18,000 per student.

- **Establish long-term funding** through the expansion of Adopt-A-Student Foundation personalized endowments to provide need-based scholarships and support operations into perpetuity.
- **Expand the financial aid model** to meet additional needs of all qualified students, regardless of how great the need.
- **Maintain small class sizes** while growing enrollment to allow for individualized instruction and a personal feel in our classrooms.
